






## Cleves School Weybridge

### DOWNSEND SCHOOL'S ECO JOURNEY

#### **Our Climate Action Plan**

We set up a Sustainability Action Team in 2022, comprising of students, teaching and non-teaching staff. Our action plan focuses on: increasing biodiversity, reducing our carbon footprint, climate education and improving our resilience and adaptability.



## 2 SCHOO'S

#### **Eco Schools**

We follow the Eco Schools Green Flag programme. Our key areas this year are: Transport, Waste and Biodiversity.

We were awarded the Green Flag with distinction and the national award for reducing Waste.

#### **Wilder Schools**

Working with Surrey Wildlife Trust, the Junior School surveyed the grounds, planted trees, created a wildflower meadow and a bucket pond. We make use of the National Education Nature Park website to map our findings.

#### **Climate Education**

Future skills and climate education are a key part of our curriculum. Students enjoyed listening to speakers from a variety of organisations and taking part in workshops, such as advocacy and an international symposium designing a sustainable school for the future.



Our aim is to increase planting for biodiversity in our school grounds by 10% this academic year. We are surveying the grounds, mapping land use, planting seeds, bulbs and trees. All students have the opportunity to be involved, through lessons, clubs and our Duke of Edinburgh programme.



#### Waste



We reduced our landfill waste and increased our recycling. Termly, we get the data from Suez and monitor our food and other waste. Our Eco Committee help organise: Christmas Jumper Swaps Book Swaps and swapping dressing up costumes. We have recycling schemes for batteries, coffee pods, clothes and toner cartridges.

#### **Energy**

Working with our Facilities and Site team, we have monitored our energy meters and looked for ways to reduce our consumption. Energy Monitors check that boards, lights and radiators and turned off and that we do not leave windows open with the heating on. In March we took part in the Earth Hour Switch Off, turning off our lights and devices to raise awareness of the need to take action.

#### Collaboration

We have worked closely with Sustainability at School to develop our eco planning. Linking with key organisations such as Eco Schools, Keep Britain Tidy, The Woodland Trust, RSPB, RHS Gardening for Schools and Learning Through Landscapes, amongst others, helps give us structure, resources and funding.

#### **Fransport**

Working with our Transport Team, Eco Committee have been trying to reduce idling in the car parks, by surveying cars and handing out leaflets. Safer Walking and Scooting workshops have been held. Over the past 2 years, there has been a significant increase in the number of students using the school buses.


#### **Our Vision**

## Fullbrook Secondary School West Byfleet

This poster was created by Fullbrook Eco Club, a group of students ranging from Year 7 to 11 who meet on a regular basis to discuss environmental issues, come up with awareness campaigns and organise events to promote sustainability. They have chosen to celebrate three school 'wins' from the past year: hosting a sustainable gift wrapping workshop, planting and maintaining a garden in the Sixth Form and receiving trees from a local charity farm called Holme Farm for our new quad area. They will be returning to Holme Farm early in November to engage with a local ecologist and to plant saplings.






#### Micklefield School Reigate







## St Paul's C of E Primary School Dorking

The children of St Paul's School, Dorking have a very passionate Eco Club which has many members. All the children thought hard about the issues we have been thinking about and then made their posters.


























































# Surrey Hills All Saints Primary School Westcott
